

Jesus, as the Lamb of God died in our place. This is the *gospel*, the good news, which is proclaimed by Christians. With full assurance, we can proclaim, "We've been acquitted!" Jesus victoriously ascended into heaven, after making an atonement for sin and reconciling us back into God's favor. Forgiveness and salvation are offered to all who repent, trust in, and follow Jesus Christ.

### What is the gift of God?

"For the wages of sin is *death*; but the gift of God is *eternal life* through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 6:23).

### How does one receive the gift of eternal life?

"These things have I written unto you that *believe* on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye *have* eternal life, and that ye may believe the name of the Son of God" (1 John 5:13).

"For ye are all the children of God by *faith* in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:26).

### Can the gift of salvation ever be earned, merited, or purchased?

"And be found in him, not having mine *own* righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of

Christ, the righteousness which is of God by *faith*” (Philippians 3:9).

“Not by works of righteousness which we have *done*, but according to his *mercy* he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost” (Titus 3:5).

“For by *grace* are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the *gift* of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast” (Ephesians 2:8-9).

If good works does not gain eternal life, why do them?

“Let your light so shine before men, that *men* may see your good works, and glorify your *Father* which is in heaven” (Matthew 5:16).

“He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that *loveth* me: and he that *loveth* me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him” (John 14:21).

Did Jesus really come to die for me?

“This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptance, that Christ Jesus *came* into the world to *save* sinners; of whom I am chief” (1 Timothy 1:15).

“For he hath made *him* to be *sin* for us, who knew no sin; that *we* might be made the righteousness of God in him” (2 Corinthians 5:21).

Reconciliation

“And he is the propitiation for *our* sins: and not for ours only, but also for the *sins* of the whole” (1 John 2:2).

### Why did Jesus have to die for my sins?

“Whosoever committeth *sin* transgresseth also the law: for sin is the transgression of the *law*” (1 John 3:4).

“And almost all things are by the law purged with blood; and without *shedding* of *blood* is no remission” (Hebrews 9:22).

“Whom God hath set forth to *be* a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the *remission* of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God” (Romans 3:25).

### Was Jesus' death sufficient to satisfy the problem of sin?

“And the veil of the temple was *rent* in twain from the top to the bottom” (Mark 15:38).

“Let us therefore come *boldly* unto the throne of *grace*, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need” (Hebrews 4:16).

“And not only so, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by *whom* we have *now* received the *atonement*” (Romans 5:11).

“When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, it is *finished*: and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost” (John 19:30).

Does God the Father truly love us this much?

“Herein is love, not that *we* loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our *sins*” (1 John 4:10).

“But *now* in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the *blood* of Christ” (Ephesians 2:13).

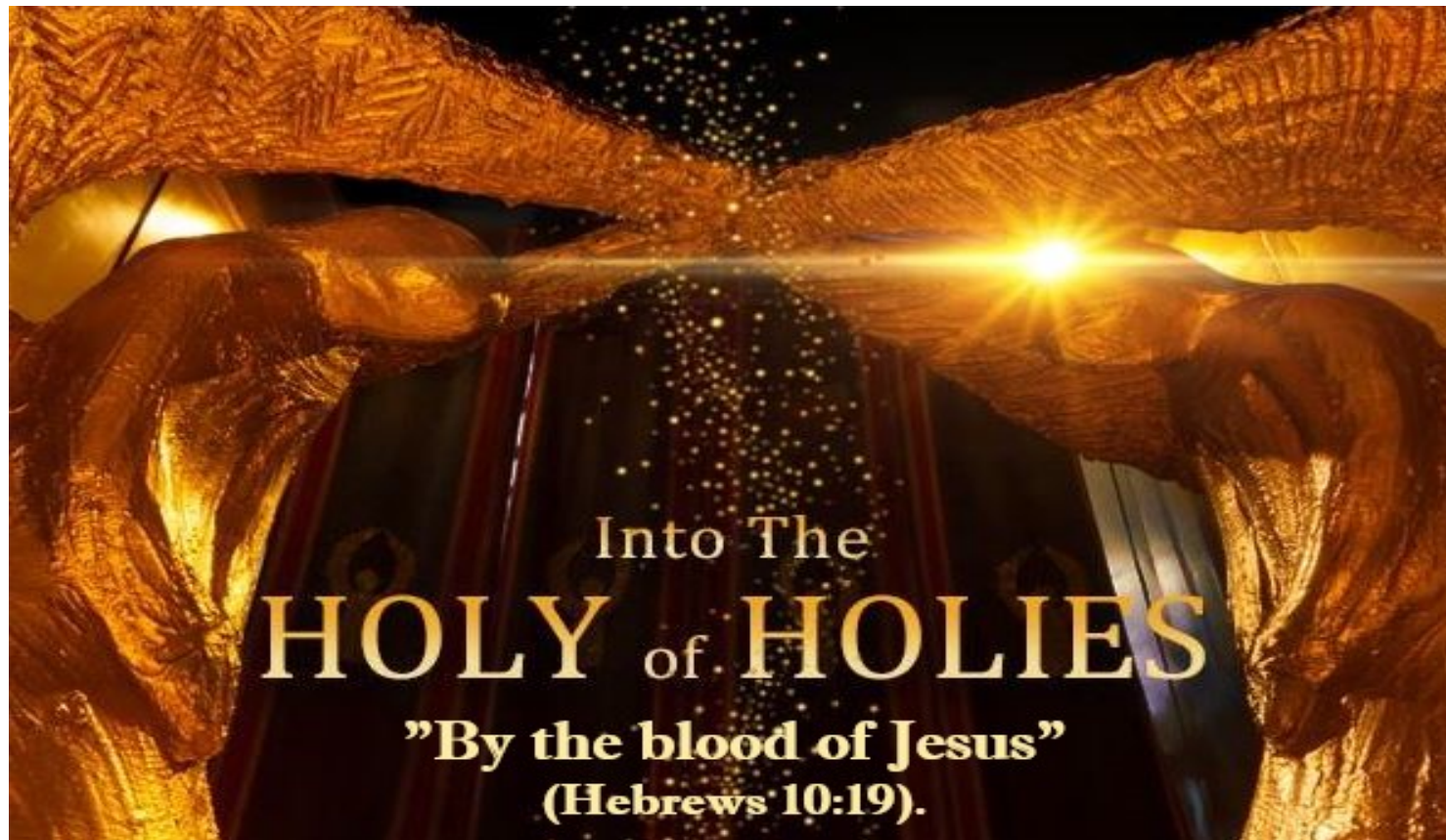
Did Jesus’ death honestly make a difference?

“Therefore as by the offence of *one* judgment came upon all men to condemnation; even so by the righteousness of *one* the free gift came upon all men unto justification of life” (Romans 5:18).

When did the Father recognize Jesus’ substitutionary death?

“For Christ is not entered into the holy *places* made with hands, which are the figures of the true; but into heaven itself, *now* to appear in the *presence* of God for us” (Hebrews 9:24).

“Much more then, being *now* justified by his *blood*, we shall be saved from wrath through him” (Romans 5:9).

Where was Jesus’ substitutionary death recognized?

“Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own *blood* he entered in once into the *holy place*, having obtained eternal redemption for us” (Hebrews 9:12).

“But this man, *after* he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever, sat down on the right hand of God” (Hebrews 10:12).

“Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the *holiest* by the *blood* of Jesus” (Hebrews 10:19).

Can we truly have full assurance of eternal life?

“Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, *hath* everlasting life, and shall not come into *condemnation*; but is passed from death unto life” (John 5:24).

“There is therefore now *no* condemnation to them which are *in* Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit” (Romans 8:1).

“The next day John seeth *Jesus* coming unto him,

and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which *taketh away* the sin of the world” (John 1:29).

## What other assurances are given?

“For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the *gift* of righteousness shall *reign* in life by one, Jesus Christ” (Romans 5:17).

“For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in *him*” (2 Corinthians 5:21).

“...for he hath said, I will *never* leave thee, nor *forsake* thee” (Hebrews 13:5).

“And, having made *peace* through the *blood* of his cross, by him to reconcile all things unto himself; by him, I say, whether they be things in earth, or things in heaven” (Col. 1:20).

“In whom we have *redemption* through his blood, the *forgiveness* of sins, according to the riches of his grace” (Ephesians 1:7).

“He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for *us* all, how shall he not with him also *freely* give us all things?” (Romans 8:32).
